


WILLIE MACKIE FUTURE SKILLS HUB

The Future Skills Hub in Kilwinning is an exciting campus development project for the College which is currently under construction on the site of our North Ayrshire Kilwinning Campus. The new Hub will replace the College's existing workshop facilities at Nethermains and enable the College to offer a dynamic and flexible curriculum aligned to the needs of local and national skills priorities. The development has been designed by Hunter Thomson Architects and construction is underway by Ashleigh (Scotland) Ltd. The Future Skills Hub is scheduled for completion to support our students during the 2023/24 academic session.

The low carbon two-storey building will provide a flexible learning space that can respond to emerging technologies as we upskill the workforce of the future in Engineering, Construction and SMART Technologies. The College facility will be supported by green technologies using air source heat pumps for the building's heating systems.
