Helen Bradford



I have always enjoyed walking in the countryside and exploring new scenic areas as I love the peace and tranquillity that this brings. I decided to buy a camera to capture the beauty of the outdoors and this became my passion. I took photographs whenever I could between juggling my full-time job and home life. I decided to take night classes at Ayrshire College and enjoyed learning and exploring photography further. I enjoyed these classes so much that I decided to quit my full-time job and study photography full-time at Ayrshire College; hopefully turning my hobby into a career. I continue to enjoy learning and challenging myself further.



Golden Hour at Kilchurn Castle, Loch Awe

This image was captured at Kilchurn Castle, Loch Awe, Argyll, in December 2019, approaching sunset on a cold, frosty winter's day. The castle was first constructed in the mid-15th century and was in ruins by 1770. It is now in the care of Historic Environment Scotland. I decided to take the photograph of the castle from across the Loch as I wanted to capture the overall beauty of the scene including the surrounding hills and the loch. I used a Canon 200D camera and 16 – 35 mm Canon lens at a focal length of 22 mm. I used a slow shutter speed of 2 minutes and 31 seconds and a Neutral Density (ND filter) to ensure that the water had a silky appearance. I used an aperture of f/9 and ISO of 800. In post-production, I wanted to show the beauty of golden hour by bringing out the blue and pink tones in the photograph. This was done very subtly by using the blue and magenta sliders in Light room.




The Beauty of Autumn at the falls of Falloch, Crianlarich

This photograph was captured in Autumn 2019, at the Falls of Falloch, Crianlarich. The waterfall stands at an impressive 30 feet high and I attempted to capture its beauty through the medium of photography. I used a Canon 200D camera and 16 – 35 mm Canon lens with a focal length of 16 mm. I wanted to achieve a silky effect to the waterfall and therefore used a slow shutter speed of 16 seconds in my camera settings. I also used a Neutral Density (ND) filter on my camera lens to prevent too much light getting into the sensor of the camera. I used an aperture of f/8 and an ISO of 100. In post-production, I wanted to bring out the warm tones of Autumn, so very slightly enhanced the oranges in the trees at the side of the waterfall for a natural effect.


The Laughing Clown

Joshua Gibson



The Setting Decade.







Grant Northcote



Starry Sky



Book by The Fire



Karra Pope




I have a major passion for photography. It's something I've practiced for almost 5 years (still going strong)

Shannon Rodie




My name is Shannon, I am 26 and I am an NC Photography student!


Isobel Shaw

Caitlin Wilson



Sky On Fire



Alex Wynne




